KIP'S MUM – EXTRA INFO!

The Hebrew books used by the Jews already had names, but these names were in Hebrew.

When these books were added into our Bible, we changed the Hebrew names to Greek ones. (The Second Testament was originally written in Greek.)

We have just learned that Genesis is Greek for 'In the Beginning', but the Hebrew name for this book is תִּשְׁאֵרֶקְ, pronounced Bereshit, which also means 'In the beginning' or 'At the start'.

In Hebrew, the book of Exodus is called תּוֹמֹשׁ, which is pronounced Sh'mot.
